Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope that you are all keeping well.

This week, the government has announced that there is no longer a plan to have all pupils returning to primary school for a month prior to the summer holidays. Instead, schools will be able to decide how many children they can safely accommodate, and which children they will prioritise. We currently have a number of children back in school from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 (the priority year groups already identified by the government), as well as some children of key workers.

We would very much like to open up this offer more widely, but can only do so if it is safe, and so our capacity is very limited. Over the coming days we will be in touch with the parents of those children still learning at home, to discuss whether parents want their children to return to school and what our availability might be.

Thank you for your ongoing support and co-operation with this changing situation. We have received nothing but positivity from all of our parents, and it really makes this difficult time more manageable.

Email Protocol - a message to our parents and carers

As we all adapt to the "new normal" it is very important to us that we work closely with parents and carers to ensure the regular communication between home and school remains. In the absence of being able to meet face to face with staff, it might mean an increase in email communication.

Contacting the school via email:

Supporting the young people in our care and managing the wellbeing and workload of our staff team is paramount. We also want to continue to support our parents and carers by responding to parental queries at the earliest opportunity. Whilst our Headteachers, teachers and associate staff are prioritising the smooth running of our schools and the reintegration of our young people, they may not be in a position to respond to emails straight away. Also, for the wellbeing of our staff, we do not expect staff to check or respond to work emails during their personal/family time.

Expectations for email communications between parents / carers and our staff:

Emails from parents/carers will be responded to during school working hours (8am-4pm). Our staff will respond to you as soon as possible and within three working days. This does not include weekends or holidays. Part-time staff may take longer to reply. If an urgent response is required, please contact the school office. We will continue to monitor our approach to email communication to improve the process further and welcome any feedback you may have.
